#### **Property Transfer Affidavit**

This form must be filed whenever real estate is transferred to a new owner (even if you are filing a deed). It must be filed with us within 45 days of the transfer to avoid penalties.

#### **Trash Collection**

Trash day is Thursday. Trash, recycling, and yard waste may not be placed at the curb before 5 p.m. Wednesday. Cans/bins must be brought in by 7 p.m. Thursday. Recycling bins are available at City Hall.

## Overnight Parking is prohibited from 2 am – 6 am on any street

#### Water/Sewer Bills

Bills are mailed quarterly and due Feb 20, May 20, Aug 20, and Nov 20

The due date for all City business is the actual due date - no extension due to weekends or holidays. Postmarks are not accepted.

Access to the **boat ramp** on Ferndale is from Pontiac Drive

Access to the **Ferndale Park** is from Oakwood.

Access to the **Lakeview beach** and all of
Lakeview Street is from
Cheltingham at Garland

**Kayak storage** spaces are available at the Community Center Park for \$25 for the season. Contact City Hall to be placed on the wait list.

#### Parks & Gates

Do NOT open or close the gates.

All City parks are private and for the enjoyment of registered Sylvan Lake residents and their guests only.

City Hall sells Park tags, Sports tags, and boat ramp keys to make sure those using the parks are residents.

During summer months we have Park Rangers patrolling the park areas that will ask to see your tag. If you do not have one you will be asked to leave the park.

Gates on Ferndale and Lakeview streets are closed daily from around Memorial Day to Labor Day. The gates are closed around noon and open no later than 9:00 p.m., depending on weather and how busy the parks are.



If our beach is chosen, Oakland County Health Division will begin bacti sampling in June. OCHD will post beach closures at the beach and re-opening information on its website. Also, sample results will be listed on the MDEO beach monitoring website.

#### What Happens When You Purchase a Property?

You should expect an increase in taxes, sometimes a significant increase. When a property or interest in a property is transferred, the following year's state equalized value (SEV) becomes that year's taxable value. You pay property taxes based on the taxable value. The SEV or Assessed Value is roughly ½ of the true cash value.

#### What Sales Information is Used in Determining Assessments?

A 24-month sales study is performed to determine property assessments. The State Tax Commission determines the timeframe.

#### Example:

Last year, you purchased a new home for \$312,000. The home was valued at \$311,060 (true cash value) with Assessed Value and State Equalized Value at \$155,530 and a Taxable Value of \$124,210.

Sales in the neighborhood show that the property has increased to \$324,140 for the current year.

Current Year:

Assessed Value is (1/2 of \$324,140) \$162,070 Taxable Value \$162,070

#### You Added A Family Room to Your Home

Last year, your home valued at \$200,000 had a \$100,000 SEV and a Taxable Value of \$80,000. You added a family room addition valued at \$40,000 (true cash value).

Sales in the neighborhood show that the true cash value of your property (with the addition) has increased to \$240,000.

Current Year:

Assessed Value (1/2 of \$240,000) \$120,000 (You are not taxed on this value)

Capped Value:

 $(\$80,000 \times 1.05^*) + 50\% \text{ of } 40,000$  \$104,000

Taxable Value, the lesser of SEV or CV \$104,000 (You are taxed on this value)

\*Calculating Inflation Rate Multiplier- The change in inflation that would have been applied in the 2023 assessment was 7.9%. However, Proposal A limits the increase to a maximum of 5%.

If you believe the <u>assessed</u> value is more than half the value of your property, you may appeal the assessment and taxable values at the Board of Review in March. Read your assessment notice sent in February for detailed information.

# **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Senior Program 2023 Season**

The CDBG Program is funding provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through Oakland County to local municipalities to assist the Communities. Sylvan Lake participates in the program to provide lawn services to Seniors.

To qualify for assistance, you must be a Sylvan Lake resident, 62 years or older, with an income less than \$28,000 for one per household or \$32,000 for a two-person household. You will need to complete the application, and provide identification that indicates your age along with your 2022 Income tax return. Funding for assistance is limited, so please apply early.

The services provided may include lawn cuts and fall yard clean-up.

Click here for an application or stop by City Hall. The application and your ID must be submitted to City Hall in order to be considered. All documents must be turned in together by April 15th, 2023. Please feel free to contact city hall with any questions at 248-682-1440.

#### Community Center

#### **Blood Drive**

The need for blood is constant and only volunteer donors can fulfill that need for patients in our community. Nationwide, someone needs a unit of blood every 2 to 3 seconds and most of us will need blood in our lifetime. Registration will be provided on Facebook closer to the event.

## **Noteworthy Information**

#### **Boat Dock Space**

When you become a resident (you must live in the City) you may sign up to be added to the boat dock waitlist. This is the beginning process in leasing a City Boat Dock Space. The current wait time is approximately six years.

#### **Do Not Open or Close the Gates**

When the gates are closed, it means the road is closed to ANY motorized traffic, including golf carts, motorcycles, or any other vehicle. With very few exceptions, only the Police, Park Rangers, and City Employees are authorized to open or close the gates. Being a resident or wanting to launch a boat does not authorize you to open any of the gates or drive

#### **No Construction on Sunday**

City Code prohibits construction or building activity on Sundays or legal holidays. Construction hours are limited to 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Mon-Sat

Check with City Hall before doing any work. A zoning permit is usually needed.

#### **Golf Carts**

State Law doesn't allow golf carts on the street. Do NOT drive your golf cart down to the beach or anywhere else in the city. The Police will be issuing tickets.

#### **Garage Sales**

You are allowed to have two garage sales in a year, and a permit is required. There is a citywide garage sale sponsored by the Sylvan Lake Home & Garden Tour, Thursday-Saturday prior to Memorial Day. Permits are available for all sales at City Hall. No signs are allowed in the road right-of-way or on City property. Signs must be removed within 24 hours of the final day.

## The City Communicates via Electronic Newsbytes.

## **Tags & Keys** will be issued only to persons showing proof of Sylvan Lake residency.

- Beach Tags \$30 (\$25 for Senior Citizens 65 years of age and older). Each Park/Beach tag entitles the resident's household plus 8 guests to the use of the park and beach areas.
- Sports/Tennis Tags \$50 Each sports tag entitles a resident to use the tennis and pickleball courts, bocce courts or volleyball court with a maximum of 3 guests.
- Boat Ramp Keys \$50
- Watercraft Sticker \$15
- Residents purchasing a Boat Ramp Key must purchase a watercraft sticker for each watercraft they intend to launch at the boat ramp or dock at their dock space. The watercraft must be registered to a Sylvan Lake resident with the resident's name and address on the registration.

#### **Police Department**

Available 24 hours, 7 days a week. The Police Department is located on the north (right) side lower level of City Hall. Call 248-682-2104. City Hall can NOT help you with Police issues.

#### **Boards & Commissions**

Planning Commission works closely with the City Manager and is an advisory group to City Council. The review zoning ordinances, re-zoning requests, and site plan reviews, to help guide commercial developments to best benefit the city. Please watch the calendar for scheduled meetings.

**Zoning Board of Appeals** is a quasi-judicial board that hears appeals from property owners seeking a variance from the zoning ordinance. They meet only when necessary.

**Board of Review** hears and acts on appeals regarding property assessment. They meet in March, July & Dec

**Tri-City Fire Board** meets quarterly and discusses and acts on various issues pertaining to the Tri-City Fire Dept. which is contracted with West Bloomfield Fire Dept.

West Bloomfield Cable Commission meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month and makes recommendations on funds provided in the franchise agreements and maintains a line of communication in the community.

The Michigan State Dog Law of 1919 requires all dogs to have a license within 30 days of ownership. Residents may purchase a dog license at City Hall, from many veterinary offices, or online at oakgov.com/petadoption.

In June Oakland County Animal Control Census Team will begin going door to door. Residents found to be housing dogs that are not licensed will be issued courtesy citations and given a period of time to comply with the law. Sylvan Lake ordinance limits each household to two (2) dogs.

When walking a dog off private property, dogs must be under reasonable control of their walker, and held securely by a leash of suitable strength, not to exceed six feet (6') in length.

- Dogs are not to be off their leash at any time.
- While walking your dog you must pick up after them.
- Dogs are not allowed to be tied up in the park.
- Dogs are not allowed in any park areas, with two exceptions.
- Dogs are allowed in the following park areas only:
- (1) Lakeview from Pontiac Drive to Cheltingham (*NOT* within the beach area) (2) Community Center Park east of Pontiac Drive (Not on the lake side of Pontiac Drive)
- Dogs are strictly prohibited and shall not be allowed in any of the following park areas.
  - (1) Ferndale Park
  - (2) Community Center Park west of Pontiac
  - (3) Lakeview Beach area
  - (4) Memorial Park

If you want your dog to go in the water you can use the canal near the bridge, or boat launch.

Dogs chasing geese – Periodically, the City contracts with Goose Busters to use their trained dogs to chase the geese out of the parks in the City. They will patrol the Ferndale, Lakeview, and Community Center Park areas.

Oakland County Water Resources Commission (WRC) has taken over the operation and maintenance of the City of Sylvan Lake's water and sewer systems as a succession plan for John Martin when he retires. John has been the City's State-Certified Water/Sewer distribution operator for more than 35 years.

For now, City Hall will continue to serve you with water and sewer billing, and you will pay your bills as you have in the past.

ALL requests and notifications should be submitted directly to WRC (see telephone numbers on the back page). Examples are reporting a water main break, sewer backup, water quality issue, requests for water shut-off/turn-on for maintenance, broken stop box (water shutoff to your home), water or sewer tap, etc. These are just examples. Again, all requests or reporting issues must be submitted to WRC. Final water reading requests can be scheduled on our website.

Payments can be made in person at City Hall, placed in the drop box by the front door, or paid online.

Accepted payments are cash, check, debit, or credit cards. You may also sign up to have your account automatically deducted on the due date. Contact City Hall to have your bill emailed to you. https://sylvanlake.org/residents/your home/utility bill s/index.php



#### **Police Chief**

The Sylvan Lake Police Department is a full-service police department. Although we are small, we provide 24/7 coverage. We do, however, contract out dispatch services. That means when a resident calls for police service, the call will be answered by a West Bloomfield dispatcher and the dispatcher will route the call to a Sylvan Lake police officer. We also contract out fire and medical services to the West Bloomfield Fire Department.

Generally, we will have one officer on the road at any given time. Because many calls for service do require a two-officer response, officers from Keego Harbor and/or Orchard Lake will usually act as back up. Officers from Sylvan Lake, Keego Harbor, and Orchard Lake, the tri-cities, also regularly train together. This partnership helps reduce training costs and ensures all officers responding in Sylvan Lake are trained properly.

Generally speaking our job is to take care of our residents. We are here to protect and serve, and all our officers are strongly encouraged to take the extra step to help people, be problem solvers, and do the little things to try and make a positive and meaningful impact on the people we encounter.

Corey O'Donohue, Sylvan Lake's Chief of Police since January of 2022. He began working in law enforcement in 1993 when the Royal Oak Police Department hired him. He worked his way up through the ranks and served as Royal Oak's Chief of Police for 11 years and for the last 6 of those years he was given the additional responsibilities of Assistant City Manager. During his 30-year law enforcement career he has had the opportunity to work in patrol, training, SWAT, narcotics, investigations, and administration.

#### **Code Enforcement**

Meet Jim Crowe our part time Code Enforcement Officer. Jim started with Sylvan Lake this past April after retiring as a police and fire dispatcher for Bloomfield Township. Jim is a very good-natured and affable person who is always smiling and upbeat, but he has the often-thankless job of enforcing our city code.

Our code enforcement officer protects our community by helping to ensure businesses and homeowners are in compliance with a variety of city ordinances that are designed to keep Sylvan Lake safe and healthy, as well as preserve property values. It is important to remember Jim doesn't make the rules, he just enforces them.

Jim will respond to complaints from residents and actively look for code violations, and he is always happy to work with any resident to help resolve the issue. The most common code violations Jim has encountered include blight, abandoned vehicles, improperly parked trailers, improperly parked vehicles, tall grass, garbage cans, animal complaints, and house numbers. Some people may think these are small issues, but small issues, if left unattended, become larger issues, sometimes very quickly.

#### **Recreational Vehicle Storage**

Please remember that you must keep your RV's at least 45 feet from the edge of the road and three feet from the side and rear property lines. Boats and/or boat trailers (only) may be in the driveway within 45 feet from the edge of the road only for the summer (April 1st to October 31st). RV's and/or boat trailers cannot be parked in the road right-of-way at any time. Only two RV's are allowed on one property at a time. RV's cannot be connected to water/sewer/electric on private property.

The Annual Fireworks display, July 3<sup>rd</sup>, is hosted by the Oakland County Boat Club.



The fireworks will be shot from a barge in the middle of the lake. There is no parking on or along any street, July 3<sup>rd</sup> (or rain date if necessary), except on approved gravel or paved parking areas. *No Parking signs are put out early but will only be enforced on the day of the fireworks*.

<u>Community Center Fireworks parking</u> is available for \$20 on the day of the fireworks. The parking lot will open at **7:00 p.m**. for paid permit parking. You must have a parking permit to enter the parking lot, including dock space holders. You may (should) purchase your parking permit at City Hall starting in June to make sure you have a spot. City Hall hours are Monday-Thursday 8 a.m.- 4:30 p.m.

<u>Volunteers are appreciated</u> to help put up the temporary "No Parking" signs in the city on the morning before July 3rd and to help take the signs down and clean up the park the day after the fireworks. <u>Consumer Fireworks</u> We want everybody to have a safe and enjoyable July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration. With that in mind, please follow the laws pertaining to the use of consumer fireworks. According to State Law and Local Ordinance, no person shall ignite, discharge, or use fireworks within the City at any time, except that, Consumer fireworks may be ignited, discharged, or used *only* between 8:00 a.m. and Midnight on July 3<sup>rd</sup>, July 4<sup>th</sup> and July 5<sup>th</sup> (The day before, of and the day after a National Holiday).

Fireworks may <u>only</u> be used on YOUR OWN private property unless you have express <u>written permission</u> from the property owner. They may not be used on Public property, including parks, streets, road right of way, or on school, church, or the private property of another. You must be at least 18 years old and cannot be under the influence of drugs or alcohol. The above regulations do not apply to low-impact fireworks such as sparklers.

**City Council** is the legislative body comprising five members the voters elect. These elections are non-partisan, and each Council member is elected to a four-year term. The mayor is selected every two years by the vote of fellow Council members and serves as chairperson of the Council.

City Council meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of each Month at 7:30 p.m. All meetings are at the Community Center and are open to the Public. (Check the calendar on the website for changes)

The City Manager is appointed by the City Council to carry out all duties as requested by Council, such as seeing that laws and ordinances are enforced, advising Council as to the financial conditions of the city, preparing the annual budget and submitting it to Council, supervising all employees in the City, overseeing all operations of the City, and many other duties. John Martin is our current City Manager. He was born and raised in Sylvan Lake with his parents, who built their home on Woodland in 1953. He has been a part of Sylvan Lake his entire life, spending countless hours in and around the lake, parks, and community center, boating, swimming, fishing, and bike riding. Before being hired by the city full-time, he worked for the City as a contractor with his dad doing construction, finish carpentry, electrical and plumbing work, and several other jobs as requested. That was in addition to his regular full-time job. John was hired as the DPW manager in 1984 and held that position for almost 8 years. During that time, he was the interim City Manager twice before being appointed City Manager in early 1992. John has accumulated certifications in many fields while working for Sylvan Lake and has seen significant positive change. He couldn't pull himself away from Sylvan Lake despite many job offers.

Another great amenity in Sylvan Lake is our four lakeside **bocce ball courts** at the Community Center Park. Bocce Ball is a simple, fun, and easy game for 2-12 players and can be enjoyed by both men and women of virtually any athletic ability. Join a league or play with friends and family.

There are three leagues. During league play, the courts are in use starting at 5:30 PM.

- Tuesday night Parks and Rec league. All slots are full, but subs are needed. Contact Patrick Runk at parksandrec@sylvanlake.org
- Wednesday night The Sylvan Bocce Club league 16 Teams. This is very competitive play, and all slots are full for 2023. Mike Grasser is the league President.

During the day, the courts are open for play except when wet, and playing on them can damage the playing surface. If people walk on them or walk their dog on them when wet, their feet sink into the surface, and then the surface needs to be repaired.

For all three leagues, bocce balls are provided. If someone wants to play other than the leagues, they will need their own bocce balls. Note that "lawn" bocce balls are different from court play.

If someone wants to learn how to play or wants initial instruction in the rules and scoring, several of the Sylvan Lake Bocce Club members would be willing to do this.


